GNAP wants to thank:

RADEZA, Universidade Lúrio (UniLúrio), Universidade Católica de Moçambique (UCM), Dr. Brower - responsible for the PLCM program Liderança na Conservação de Moçambique (Leadership Program for Conservation in Mozambique- Biofund) and the warden of Pebane district for their visits.

Key Issues

- Law Enforcement chief Mr. Zavale attended the 3rd national meeting for the supervision of conservation areas in Nampula, held by ANAC Administração Nacional das Áreas de Conservação (National Administration for the Conservation Areas)
- NTFPs project coordinator, Mrs. Lupaka, was invited by the Faculty of Natural Sciences of Lúrio
 University to share her experiences in community engagement during a webinar for biodiversity
 conservation;
- GNAP participated in the biannual coordination meeting in Gilé as part of the second phase of the
 ACAMOZ 2 project, financed by AFD Agence Française de Développement (French Development
 Agency), in collaboration with Nitidæ and Instituto das Amêndoas (Cashew Institute). SDAE Serviço
 Distrital de Actividades Económicas (District Economic Activities Services) and the cashew
 producers were also present;
- The 5th of June, GNAP's staff celebrated the World Environment Day together with the authorities
 of Naburi Administrative Post, the Musseia Basic School Management Council, the Musseia
 Environmental Club, the CGRNs Comités de Gestão de Recursos Naturais (Natural Resources
 Management Committee) and the communities of the GNAP Buffer Zone;
- Recently 176 kudos, 163 sables and 111 waterbucks have been observed in the miombo forest;
- 4 collared elephants have been monitored daily.

GNAP Management

Management and Infrastructures

- Etaga guard post: the construction of a new water hole is underway;
 Malema Mujaiane mushroom house: the door and window finishing are completed. Sheets were applied to the dryer;
- Lice tourist camp: conservation of the infrastructures was checked and all damaged structures were removed:

- Daily maintenance activities were guaranteed in Musseia Headquarters;
 Cutting of grass, treetops and fallen logs was completed on 109 km of roads in key locations. The bridge platform over the Malema River was filled with gravel. Critical points were detected on the road from Mocubela to Mulela guard post;
- 33 seasonal workers were recruited monthly to support the infrastructure development.

Conservation and Science

- 58 common duikers, 57 bush pigs, 47 reedbucks, 32 bushbucks, 16 buffaloes, 14 warthogs, 4 red
 duikers, one wildebeest and one klipspringer have been directly observed;
- Elephant and zebra spoors were also recorded;



Law Enforcement

- 61 patrols, 35 ambushes, 3 road-blocks were carried out, covering a total of 915 km on foot and more than 3,700 by car;
- 15 illegal activities mainly related to poaching have been detected and 23 tools have been confiscated, including a weapon. One illegal logger has been arrested;
- The department participated in the regional meeting against biodiversity crimes held in Cabo Delgado province.



Community Development and Sustainable Livelihoods

- Projecto XADREZ (Chess program): 63 girls from 9 schools attended the program. 11 training sessions in schools were held involving 39 participants;
- Agriculture campaign: 53 gardens were monitored. 120 kg of Nhemba beans were distributed in 3
 communities. As part of the Development project with RADEZA, 63 agricultural tools and seeds were
 distributed in one of the communities involved;
- Nursery: 16 new nurseries have been implemented in the Buffer Zone. 9,3 hectares of degraded area

were subject to reforestation activities. 20 kg of bananas and 5 kg of pumpkin have been produced in Musseia nursery;

- NTFPs project:
 - Honey: 28 hives were monitored, 15 kg of honey has been sold, almost 7 kg of raw wax was produced;
 - Mushrooms: 37 collection groups were monitored. Collected mushrooms were subjected to quality control;
 - Snails: 450 snails were sold. 3 community snail farms were monitored;
 - Peanuts: 7.5 kg of peanut butter has been packaged and commercial testing will follow.
